ALA Unit 383 Fair Oaks Honors It's Dual Members

Everyone has a story. Especially those in the military, and especially women in the military.

On March 26, 2024, American Legion Unit 383 in Fair Oaks surprised their four dual members: members of VFW Post 6158 and American Legion Auxiliary 383 with a surprise celebration to acknowledge and honor them for their service to their country and their continued work in Unit 383.

Unit president Sandy Sedden-Rice and member Judy Long had been working hard to put together this impromptu ceremony for the members. Member Catherine, (daughter of Susan Baker), helped with the ceremony.

Mid meeting business was officially paused and members Tish Lovisone, Marines; Christine McGlasson, Air Force and Navy; Julie Nattkemper, Army; and Marge Waggoner, Navy, were asked to come forward. President Seddon-Rice told them they were there to be recognized for their service to their country and unit.

Unit Historian, and local reporter Elise Spleiss delivered a "History of Women in the Military" talk from the Revolutionary War to WWI, WWII, Korea, and Vietnam.

From working only in supportive roles, to formally serving in WWI, still only performing clerical duties and with the Army Nurse Corps. In 1942 the Women's Army Auxiliary was set up and later renamed Women's Army Corps as women formally became official members of the United States Army.

Several of our members were WAVES, Women Accepted for Voluntary Enlistment Services. At the same time, in WWII women were accepted into the Navy in non-combative roles. Women's Air Force Service Pilots (WASP) was created in WWII.

The need for women in the military was waning until the Korean and Vietnam wars brought them back to work in only non-combative roles.

In 1973 the military draft ended and transitioned to an all-volunteer force where women could serve in more capacities. In 1976 the first group of women was admitted to the US Military Academy at West Point. 1978 the Women's Army Corps was disbanded as women were fully integrated into the Army.

In 1990, the creation of Combat Aviation opened support roles for women. In 2013 the Dept. of Defense finally lifted the ban on women serving in combat roles opening up thousands of added positions to female service members. Today women are serving in combat roles in all branches of the military on missions throughout the world.

Following the women in the military history lesson each honoree was presented with a certificate of appreciation and a bright bouquet of yellow daffodils symbolizing strength and resilience.

Each lady then shared about their job in the service or other information.

Marge told about an experience when she was young, "since I was with the Marines there two Marines who wanted to go out to dinner. They asked if I would like to go with them. I said, "I'd love to so, here these guys showed up in their dress blues. We went to Waikiki for dinner and I'm telling you, everybody was looking and admiring, and I was really thrilled that I had two Marines in dress blues on each side of me!" Moments to remember!

Tish said, "I did maintenance management. I made sure the equipment was ready to go to war. I did reports, I was an analyst; the same kind of work I do today. I built reports, statistics and spreadsheets back in the 80's before we ever had MS Windows and a mouse." Christine tells of an interesting day with an awkward ending, "I was a producer and a writer and announcer at a local television station. We went all over the world taping. At that time, it was a 2-inch videotape we transferred to film. I don't know if any of you remember 'Laugh in'. We were at an Air Force base; they got some local talent, and we did a 'Laugh In' spoof on the assembly of the B-52. We used women in the sketches to keep the pilot's (all men) interest." It had been a long day and she had not left with the other ladies. This made for was an interesting rest of her time following that job since it had brought her to a "men only" facility which forced her into an amusing predicament which lasted over an hour but gave her a delightful story.

Julia was working at the end of the Cold War. She could not share a lot about what she did but did mention she spoke Russian saying, "If you think about satellites and things like that then you have an idea what I did" Anyway, on one of those jobs, "if I told you more" she made it clear she just couldn't!

This was a fun time, albeit a short one, we found out a lot about our veteran members realizing we did not really know them. It gave us a new appreciation for what they had done in their time in the service which helped make them the women they are today, still working hard to make a difference in wherever their lives take them.
